To compete in Show Pony and Show Hunter Pony classes ponies must be registered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB, the GSB, the AHSB, the AASB or in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part-Breds are not eligible unless entered in the NPS British Riding Pony Stud Book, Register, Appendix, International or Sports Pony section of the BRPSB.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS **Qualifying or Life** members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from **August 2020**

CA of WPCS RULES:

1. The Cornish Association of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society does not accept liability for any loss of property or any accident or damage to any animal, vehicle, spectator or exhibitor, and all the entries are accepted subject to this condition.
2. ALL Exhibitors MUST have their own Public Liability Insurance and must have read a copy of the show's Health and Safety Policy and agree to abide by the requests contained within. A copy will be on the reverse of all entry forms, available on the website and in the Secretary's Office. Making entries to the show is acceptance of our requirement for Public Liability Insurance and acceptance of our Health and Safety Statement.
3. Native ponies must be exhibited in their natural state.
4. Riders must wear a riding hat which complies with the current safety standard at all times when mounted.
5. No trotting, cantering or galloping outside of the designated warm-up arenas.
6. The judges' decision is final.
7. All native ponies competing in M&M classes must be registered in the main studbook of their breed society.
8. Passports must accompany the horse or pony to the show.
9. All ponies entered in ridden class must be 4 years and over.
10. All foals must be at least 3 weeks old at the date of the show and must accompany the mare in the ring.
11. Entry fees will not be refunded (unless the show is cancelled).
12. Complaints must to be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of £20 (this will be refunded if the complaint is upheld).
13. Dogs are to be kept on leads at all times.
14. In case of emergency, show organisers reserve the right to prevent entry to or exit from the showground.

EXHIBITOR – YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Exhibitor – you/we will need to provide the WPCS with certain personal information relating to you. TSR Affiliation Rules 2019

This show is a qualifier for the 2019 TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals! TSR RIDERS FINALS - 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring. TSR IN HAND FINALS - The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand Card will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their cards signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at <http://www.theshowingregister.co.uk/>

SPSBS AFFILIATION RULES 2018

1. Classes must be confined to Registered Ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (i.e. foals)

2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show. All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc.
3. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and takes no further part.

NPS Affiliation

The highest placed pony in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members. At Breed Shows ponies can qualify for the final even if their owners are not NPS members. The owner of a pony qualifying at a Breed Show must become an NPS Qualifying or Life member for the pony to enter the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

Designated Breed Shows may run mixed breed classes alongside their breed classes but these will be subject to "normal" qualification rules.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. Stallion discs MUST be worn in ridden classes.

NPS Silver Medal Championships. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at NPS Summer Championship Show 2020.

Health & Safety Guidelines

Horses & ponies are large and unpredictable animals, please take every possible care and precaution to ensure the safety of you and others at all times.

- Cornish Association of the Welsh Pony & Cob Society do not accept liability for any loss of property or any accident or damage to any animal, vehicle, spectator or exhibitor, and all the entries are accepted subject to this condition. **Competitors & owners MUST have their own third party public liability insurance in order to enter and compete at this event.**
- Stallions may only be handled by experienced and competent people over the age of 14 years.
- No trotting, cantering or galloping on the show ground except in designated warm up areas.
- Horses & ponies should not be tied to horse boxes or trailers and horses & ponies should never be left unattended.
- Riding hats which comply with the current safety standard must be worn *at all times* when mounted and we strongly recommend that hard hats are worn when leading all horses & ponies. All children under 16 years of age must wear hard hats when handling horses & ponies. Appropriate footwear must be worn at all times.
- No child under 16 years of age may compete without an accompanying adult. All lone competitors must report to the show secretary and provide an emergency contact number.
- It is forbidden to ride one horse/pony and lead another or to lead more than one horse/pony at any time.
- No competitor may continue to compete following a fall of the horse or rider.
- All gates to the show field must be kept closed at all times.
- Horses & ponies must never be taken into pedestrian walkways.
- Dogs must be kept on short leads at all times.
- Spectators and other pedestrians must take care when negotiating the showground and use designated pedestrian walkways & viewing areas where provided. Extra care must be taken with children and pushchairs.
- First aid contacts will be displayed on notices around the showground or first aiders can be contacted by the show secretary. All accidents & injuries must be reported to the show secretary and logged in the accident book. **In case of emergency call 999.**
