
- 1. All entries must be made on the Show's printed online / printed form and be accompanied by the appropriate remittance for the classes entered.
- 2. The Westmorland County Agricultural Society privacy policy sets out the basis on which any personal data we collect from you, that you provide to us or that we may receive from others about you will be processed by us. It includes data that we hold electronically and in paper files. Names, limited address particulars and details of entries may be published in a catalogue of entries (in printed form and online). Results information may be published (in printed form and online) and provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication.

- 3. All exhibitors agree to abide by Rules and Conditions quoted by submitting their entry.

- 4. No person (except in the case of a son succeeding his father, a widow her husband) shall be admitted to claim for the best managed farm until he has been in bona-fide occupation of such farm for three years at least. The judges in making their awards shall have special regard to the improvements made by the Tenant as distinguished from those made by the Landlord.
- 5. If a person shall obtain a First Prize in any of the Farms & Stocks classes (classes 1-12) for two consecutive years, he shall not be entitled to compete again for the same Prize in the year immediately succeeding the date of the second award; and whenever such person shall again become a competitor, the judges shall direct their attention particularly to the improvements made on the farm during the last two years.
- 6. The word 'Farm' shall mean the entire holding or holdings of the competitor, being either proprietary occupier or tenant, when lying together or farmed from the same homestead, exclusive of woods, roads, rivers and high-lying grounds not adapted for ploughing, and whether or not farmed under different landlords or held under different agreements.
 NB Inasmuch as it is impossible to frame this Rule so as to meet every case, the Committee shall have power, in the event of dispute to decide each case on its own merits, but in accordance as far as possible with the true intent and spirit of this Rule, and their decisions shall
- 7. The judges' decision is final.
- 8. Any protest must be made in writing (email acceptable), sent to the Chief Executive by 17 September and to be accompanied by a deposit of £50 to be returned, or retained, by the vote of the Committee (consisting of the Referee, Chairman, Chief Executive and appropriate Chief Steward) on consideration there was reasonable ground or not for the protest. The deposit is to discourage frivolous protests.
- 9. On-farm judging classes are held under the Government Guidelines re Covid-19 as at the time of judging, local to the address of the farm.
- 10. Video classes videos and 2 x still photos are to be submitted online at https://showingscene.com/. Exhibitors are encouraged to video their entry in such a way as to give the judge as good a perspective as possible. Videos/photos must include the appropriate "The Alternative Westmorland Show" logo.
- 11. Prize money will be sent by cheque by the end of September. Unless otherwise stated, the payee will be in the name of the exhibitor.


